Faith Formation with Ms. DiPietro

During Lent, we prepare for Holy Week and Easter.

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord: On this day the church recalls the entrance of Christ the Lord into Jerusalem to accomplish his Paschal mystery. The Mass of the Holy Chrism is celebrated on the Tuesday of Holy Week. The Chrism Mass gathers the diocesan family to celebrate the unity of all persons who have been anointed with Holy Chrism at Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders. The bishop will bless the Holy Oils to be used in our parishes and diocesan liturgies in the coming year. During this Mass, the priests of the Diocese will renew their commitment to service in the Church.

SACRED PASCHAL TRIDUUM - Holy Thursday: Lent concludes with the beginning of the Mass of the Lord's Supper, which is the principal liturgy of the day. On Holy Thursday, the only Masses permitted are the Mass of the Lord's Supper and the Chrism Mass. It is appropriate that the oils for the sick, catechumens and Sacred Chrism, which are blessed by the bishop during the Chrism Mass, be presented to and received in local parish communities. Good Friday: According to the Church's ancient tradition, Mass is not celebrated on this day. Liturgy of the Word (consists of all the readings) First Reading, Responsorial Psalm, Second Reading, The Passion of the Lord, Veneration of the Cross, Priest - "This is the wood of the Cross" People respond - Come let us worship, Holy Communion. Holy Saturday: Night (Vigil) The church is in darkness, the lighting of the new fire takes place outside. The new paschal candle is lit from the new fire. The Priest carries the lit Paschal candle into the dark church and proclaims "it is light of Christ" people in the pews light their candles, when Father reaches the sanctuary the whole church is lit with candlelight. There are reading from the Old & New Testament. When the Epistle is read all the lights in the church are turned on. The Gospel acclamation "Alleluia" is sung for the first time since Lent began. This a wonderful celebration. Easter Sunday - The Mass of Resurrections is celebrated.
